This is a reading-intensive, discussion-based seminar for juniors, seniors, and graduate students. It is assumed that you have either a substantial background in (1) history (it need not be in Asian history) and/or (2) Asian studies. Everything in this syllabus is contingent on the pandemic.			
授業の目的 Purpose	This course is an upper-division seminar in East Asian history, with a focus on (1) understanding the region 's cultures and histories, and (2) placing the history of East Asia within a world history context. Note that assignments are different for graduate and undergraduate students, as described below!			
授業の内容 授業の方法 Content	Rather than focusing primarily on the histories of terrestrial nation-states, we will spend more time examining topics and spaces including marginal territories; flows of people, goods, and ideas; and globalization, past and present.
